Q: What should I do if I can't find my curbstop?

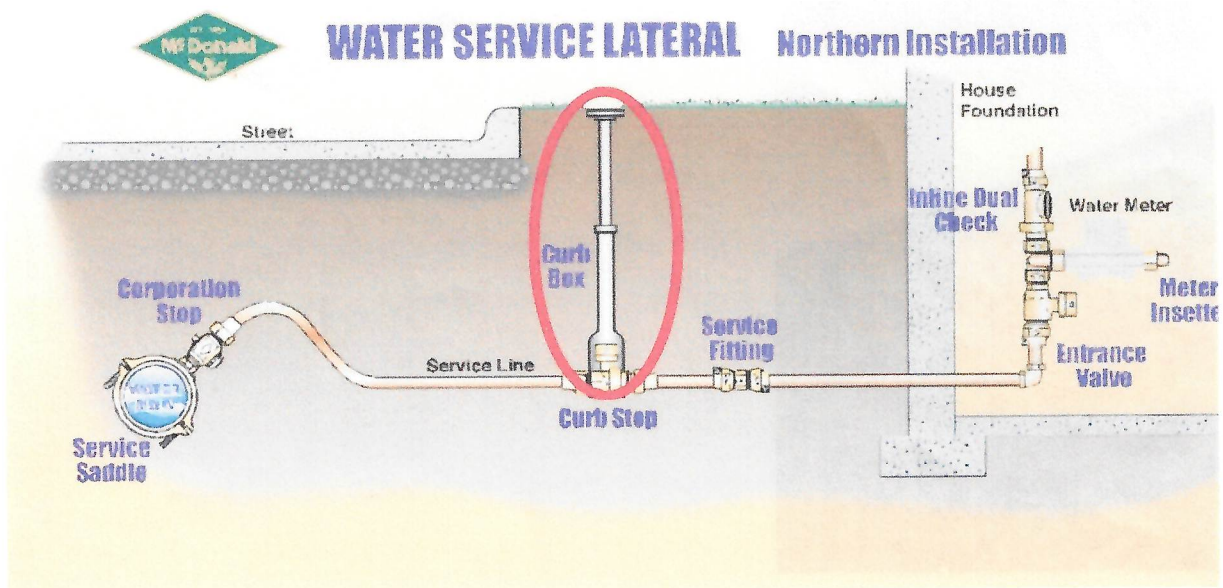

CURBSTOPS

Q: What is a curbstop?

A: A curbstop is a main underground shut-off valve located on the water service line between the public water main and private property. It stops water from flowing from the water main in the street to the actual house. A water key is needed to reach the operating nut, which shuts off the water. Many curbstops are buried under dirt, landscaping, gravel, and even concrete. Knowing where your curbstop is located can help out during a water emergency.



Q: Why is it important?

A: It enables municipal workers and plumbers to turn off water flow to your house for emergencies or repairs. It isolates a water shut off to your home only, so your neighbors are not affected by any work or repair that is being done on your property.

Q: Where is it located?

A: It is usually located 6' underground on your property. Many curbstops are on property lines, but corner lots can have different locations. Most are 10-20 feet from the edge of the road. Each house/residence has its own curbstop.
